USING VIDEO TO SAVE THE PLANET

DRAMA, 9.30AM - 3.30PM, AGES 7-11 YRS

News reports and infomercials are some of the most important ways we share information. They can also provide tips to help inspire others to support your cause. In this workshop our young filmmakers will be challenged to think about ways we can all help ourselves and each other to make the planet a more sustainable place. Through video, we will demonstrate just how simple actions in the home and in the local community can add up to a more sustainable way of life that can help save the planet. We will use comedy, shock, drama and facts to make videos that make friends and family think more about their everyday habits and choices. Together, we will make videos to save the planet!

PRINTING WITH WHAT?

ART, 9.30AM - 4PM, AGES 5-11 YRS

We will play around with constructing printing tools using everyday objects such as wood, string and wire to create some unusual and wonderful marks on fabric! We will learn how to make repeat patterns, experiment with working on a large scale and come up with designs for clothing and accessories to create from the printed fabric we make.

BUILD YOUR BEST BEAT

MUSIC, 9.30AM - 3.30PM, AGES 8-14 YRS

Ever wondered how music is put together in a studio? Come and find out using Logic Pro which professional producers use to create the songs you listen to. We will explore music production and composition using elements of current popular styles including Trap, R&B and Hip Hop. We will work with loops, samples and record our own vocal effects to collectively construct a beat. We'll be reusing snippets of famous songs to recycle into a new track, together with your own ideas. Bring any instruments you play, and we may incorporate them into the track. We will complete one track and upload it to YouTube to amaze our friends and family. No prior musical knowledge needed, just come and find out how creative you can be!

FROM THE TINY SEED

DESIGN YOUR OWN SUSTAINABLE SETTLEMENT

ART, 9.15AM - 3.45PM, AGES 5-11 YRS

We will create large illustrated and collaged aerial maps to plan sustainable island environments incorporating natural and man-made elements. We will acknowledge climate change by reusing materials, exploring self-sufficiency and considering environmentally friendly travel. Inspired by the work of Olafur Eliasson and worldwide sustainability goals, make shoe box models of your settlement using only recycled and natural materials. Use old plastic bottles to design, decorate and create flower pots in which to plant a tree, and plan where you will plant this. Design and paint a t-shirt to reflect and promote sustainability, inspired by your illustrations and models.

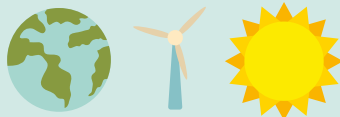
